School Bus Chassis Bids Taken

Bids for eight school bus chassis were opened at 4 p.m. Friday afternoon by Assistant School Supt, James Read.

Five bids were submitted, but the bid by O'Green Ford, some \$700 lower than the highestbid, was discarded because it failed to meet school district specifications.

Hall GMC, Inc., submitted the igh bid of \$3,983 for one unit, \$31,864 for eight units.

Next lowest bid to O'Green Ford's eight-unit price of \$25,913,20 was Town and Coun-try Dodge, which bid \$26,289,20 for the total package \$3,336.15 per unit.

A decision will be made by the Board of Education at its meeting Monday night, Feb. 26.
