Michigan sophomore from Peru. Utley has the fastest time this year of 1:58.9, but Williams and Bello are 2:00.1, and 2:00.3, respectively and are improving.

MDs Back Evaluation Of Drivers

LANSING--A medical evaluation board on driver licensing for Michigan has won "strong endorsement from the Michigan State Medical Society."

The committee on Highway Injury of the state medical society, headed by Dr. Paul W. Citrus, M.D., University of Michigan pathologist, met recently with Secretary of State James M. Hare, and officials of the Michigan Department of State and endorsed House Bill 2151.

UNDER THE BILL, the board would be comprised of four members but would be able to obtain consultation from all types of specialists in the medical field.

Legislation sets up a panel of three licensed physicians, designating one ophthalmologist (medical doctor who specializes in eye care), one psychiatrist, and a third medical doctor whose specialty is not designated. The fourth member would be an optometrist.

Set forth in H.B. 2151, the board would serve as technical advisor to the Secretary of State relative to medical statements received regarding applications for operator and chauffeur licenses. The board's job would be to evaluate any physical or mental conditions which might impair the applicant's driving abilities.

HARE SAID he was optimistic of the measure's chances in the Legislature this year. "It has support from the administration and now that the medical society has added its strong backing, I'm enthused over its chances."

Some 20 states already have state medical evaluation boards.

Only cases in which there was dispute over whether the individual was medically fit to drive would come before the evaluation board. Estimates place this number at about 25 a week or less. In other medical cases, Hare said, guidelines set up for his driver improvement clinic, review units would clearly indicate the action to be taken.

GM Reports Hike In New Car Sales

New passenger car sales by General Motors dealers in the United States totaled 92,978 units in the second 10 days of February, up 10.9 per cent from 83,497 sold in the same period a year ago, H.E. Crawford, vice president in charge of the Marketing Staff, announced Monday.

Commercial vehicle sales in the period were 16,794, an increase of 10.9 per cent over the year-ago figure of 15,139. Total sales were 109,772, compared with 98,635 a year ago.

SALES IN THE first 20 days of February also showed substantial gains over those of the same 20 days of February, 1967.

Passenger car sales in the first 20 days of this February were 156,959, an increase of 10.3 per cent over the 159,027 in the same 20 days a year ago. Commercial vehicle sales rose 8.3 per cent, totaling 34,771, compared with 32,114 in the same period last year. Total sales were 221,170 in the first 20 days of February, compared with 201,141 in February, 1967.
