Student Shows Slides

Charlie Conn, Farmington High School senior took members of the Kiwanis Club of Farmington on a trip through the Grand Canyon by raft on the Colorado River with his slides of the trip at the group's meeting Feb. 27 in Bolsford Inn.

With his father and a staff member of "Field and Stream" magazine, Conn traveled the 200 miles through rapids, past waterfalls and wild game, past caves and the steep walls of the canyon.

The trip was described in the January issue of "Field and Stream." Conn, when he took the trip, was just 16 and made it while he had a broken arm. During the trip, he climbed many of the walls of the canyon and also climbed to the site of the crash of two commercial airliners which occurred in 1956. He brought down a piece of one of the planes.

The only drinking water the party had on the trip was the muddy water of the Colorado and the temperatures sometimes shot up as high as 120 degrees. The Kiwanis Club of North Farmington joined the Farmington group for the program which was presided over by Bob Van Every, vice president.
