## At 55 MPH, Your Death Is Quick

How are your driving habits? Out of automobile-crash research at Cornell University Medical College, have come terrifying pictures of what happens to steel and glass, and flesh and blood, in the split-second a human is being hurled into eternity.

This is a reconstruction of what will happen when your car traveling 55 m.p.h. hits a tree.

1/10 SECOND: Your front bumper and chrome frosting of the grill collapse. Silvers of steel penetrate the tree one-and-a-half inches or more.

2/10 SECOND: Your hood crumples as it rises, smashing into your windshield. The spinning wheels leave the ground. The grill disintegrates. Your fenders come in contact with the tree, forcing the rear part to splay out over the front doors. Your body continues to

move forward at the vehicle's original speed, a force of 20 times gravity, your body weighing 3,200 pounds. Your legs ramrod straight, snap at the knee joints.

3/10 SECOND: Your body is off the seat, torso upright, broken knees pressing against the dashboard. The plastic and steel frame of the steering wheel begins to bend under your death grip. Your head is now near the sunvisor, your chest above the steering column.

4/10 SECOND: The car's front 24 inches are now completely demolished, but the rear is still traveling at 55 m.p.h. The half-ton motor car crunches into the tree. The rear of the car rises high enough to scrape bark off low branches.

5/10 SECOND: Your fear-frozen hands bend the steering column into an almost vertical

position. Jagged steel punctures lungs and intercostal arteries. Blood spurts into your lungs.

6/10 SECOND: So great is the force of impact that your feet are ripped from your tightly laced shoes. The chassis bends in the middle, sheering the body bolts. Your head smashes into the windshield. The rear of the car begins its downward fall, spinning wheels digging into the ground.

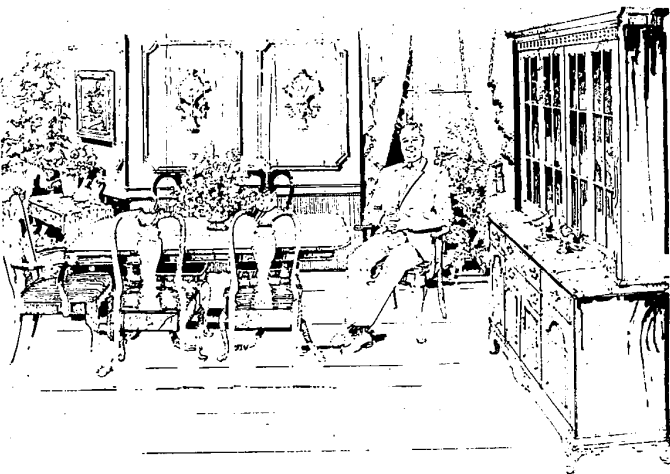

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## Did You Receive An Unsolicited Credit Card?

(This is a public service article explaining in general terms a provision of Michigan law. Individuals who wish to determine the effect of any law upon their private legal affairs should consult a private attorney.)

Recently credit cards have become more prevalent than

old cash and it would appear, are being used more.

Because of the cards' acceptance by consumers, businesses and companies have sent credit cards to individuals unsolicited and without the individual's permission. If such cards are lost or stolen, problems concerning the liability of the issuer and the consumer arise.

IF ANYONE receives an un-

solicited credit card through the mail, he will incur no liability if he immediately destroys the card before using it.

The recipient is under no obligation to contact or notify the issuer of his action nor of his receipt of the card. Nor is he obligated to return the card to the issuer.

On the other hand, should the recipient use the card, he

has then agreed to accept it and will be liable for any future purchases made by its use until it is either returned to the issuer, or destroyed and written notification communicated to the issuer.

IF THE unsolicited card is stolen and subsequently used by an unauthorized individual, the original recipient cannot be held liable for any charges incurred.

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
