UM-Dearborn Offers Child Behavior Course

Want to understand your child a little better? Would you like to know more about how children learn and develop, why they succeed or fail, what makes them lovable at times and sometimes not so lovable? Questions such as these will be discussed in the Spring series of university non-credit courses to be offered at the Dearborn Campus of the University of Michigan.

One of the highlights of the series will be a course entitled "Child Behavior Management for Parents." Taught by two experienced child psychologists, the course promises to help parents "recognize, define, and influence the behavior traits of their children."

THROUGH DISCUSSIONS and demonstrations, aided by expert lectures, parents can help each other become better acquainted with the problems faced by all children. This course cannot solve the emotional problems of seriously disturbed parents or children, the instructors admit, but it can better prepare parents to meet the daily challenges of parenthood.

This course is just one of more than 30 courses offered at the Dearborn Campus be-

ginning on March 7 and running for 12 weeks. Registration began on February 26 and will continue through the first week of classes.

History Of The Negro Displayed

Honoring the 40th anniversary of Negro History Week, the Detroit Historical Museum will continue through March, an exhibit that features items and pictures associated with the Negro in Detroit.

The exhibit was created from material in the Museum's files and collection of artifacts associated with prominent Detroit Negroes.

Negro History Week, in February, was instituted in 1926 by Dr. Carter Goodwin Woodson, director of the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History.

Featured new accessions in the exhibit are medals and trophies awarded to Olympic runner Eddie Toan and pictures and articles associated with the career of Charles H. Mahoney, first American Negro delegate to the United Nations. On display from the Museum's portrait collection is an oil painting of William Webb, early Detroit abolitionist who hosted the historic Frederick Douglass-John Brown meeting.

Mrs. Willard Connelley has loaned a Civil War photograph of her grandfather, Corporal Kinchen Artie, for the exhibit. This is the only known photograph of an enlisted man in the uniform of the 1st Michigan Colored Infantry Regiment.

Other items on display focus on types of resource materials and artifacts the Museum is hoping to acquire to expand its Negro History files and collections. Society members are invited to contact the Museum if they have any items associated with Detroit Negro History to donate.

The exhibit is on view in the Museum's main floor area. The Detroit Historical Museum is open Tuesday through Sunday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Admission is free.
