Company Schedules Performance

Plays and poetry with a virtuoso company of deaf actors, disciplined by some of the nation's top directors will be presented by the touring National Theatre of the Deaf in its only Detroit appearance, Thursday, March 14, at 8:30 p.m. in the auditorium of the Detroit Institute of Arts.

This is unusual theater.

OF THE HIGHEST professional caliber, the performance

is intended not only for the deaf but for a general audience of drama lovers. Two narrators stand on each side of the stage to relate the manual sign language to the play's dialogue development.

The National Theatre of the Deaf is a special project of the Eugene O'Neill Memorial Theatre Foundation, and it has enlisted the participation of directors who have won fame for commercial and experi-

mental drama. They include Yoshio Aoyama, Alvin Epstein, John Hirsch, Gene Lasko and Joe Layton.

The presentation will include mime, dance, music and manual sign language, with simultaneous narration in a series of plays and poetry.

The plays are musically accompanied by instruments "sculptured for music" by designer Francois Baschet. They are made of gleaming aluminum and other metals which reflect light and, in the words of the producers, "they throw enough to be felt by the deaf actors as cues."

A teacher of political science, he became nationally known in 1956 with the publication of his book, "Second Consul: The Vice Presidency — Our Greatest Political Problem." This study of the nation's second highest office was widely read by government officials and others.

OPERA FARE for the evening will be Martin Kalmanoff's "A Quiet Game of Cribble," and Carl Maria Von Weber's "Abu

Hassan."

Kalmanoff's satirical commentary on the living conditions of modern man will feature Warren Jaworski as the Com-mentator and Marjorie Gordon and Jonathan Swift as the Husband and Wife.

THE OPERA, with libretto by James L. Limbacher, is the story of Abu, gardener to the Caliph of Baghdad, who is a gluttonous spendthrift. He is deeply in debt and the Caliph has forgotten to pay him. Abu conspires with Fatima, his wife, to have his debts canceled by trickery.

Complications set in when the two pretend to die in order to collect the funeral expenses. But, as in all comic operas, everything ends happily.




