

Senate Adds Riot Provision To Civil Rights Bill

THE U.S. SENATE last week expanded the current, proposed civil rights bill by making it a federal crime to cross state lines with intent to incite a riot. At the present time, the measure includes a ban on discrimination in the sale and rental of houses and stiff federal penalties for persons convicted of intimidating or injuring civil rights workers or Negroes under certain circumstances.

DR. MILFORD O. ROUSE, president of the American Medical Association, said he found fault with major phases of President Nixon's medicare program.

FORMER VICE PRESIDENT Richard M. Nixon, now a candidate seeking the GOP nomination for president, told an audience last week that a new administration could end the war in Vietnam. He didn't, however, offer any proposed solution.

CALIFORNIA GOV. Ronald Reagan has pledged his support for Nelson Rockefeller for president if the New York governor wins the GOP nomination.

In so doing, Reagan disagreed with Barry Goldwater, who said that he will not support Rockefeller.

TWO MEMBERS of the singing group "The Temptations" were injured slightly last Tuesday in a truck-auto crash on the Pennsylvania Turnpike. Otis W. Miles, 26, and Eddie J. Kedricks, 29, were treated at Somerset Community Hospital for minor injuries and were released.

THE SUPREME Court has refused to review the case of a Catholic sentenced to two years in jail after refusing Army induction on grounds he could not participate in an "unjust" war. In his appeal, Stephen Spiro, 29, of Hackensack, N.J., said he had cited as grounds for his action the Just Doctrine. He claimed that this was an official teaching of the Catholic Church but never promulgated officially in any Church statement.

It's Tougher To Plead Guilty

APPEALS JUDGE Horace Gilmore's opinion was written in the case of an indigent man who pleaded guilty to attempted larceny in 1965.

Jackson County Circuit Judge John Simpson did not advise him of the penalties attached to a guilty plea and refused to let him withdraw it.

The Appeals Court overturned Simpson's ruling and sent the case back for a new trial conforming to the Gilmore standards.

IN HANDLING guilty pleas, the appeals court said, a trial judge must:

- Advise the defendant of his right to have a lawyer, and appoint one if he cannot afford legal help.
- Make a verbatim record of all proceedings.
