

# MSU Dean New Northern Prexy

## State And Local

DR. JOHN K. JAMRICH, 47-year-old associate dean of the College of Education at Michigan State University, was named President of Northern Michigan University last Thursday. Dr. Jamrich will take over July 1. He succeeds Dr. Edgar L. Harden, who resigned last October after 11 years as Northern's president.

THE HOUSE SUCCEEDED last week in adopting a substitute for a controversial local emergency powers bill, but only after leaders promised opponents they would get another day of debate before a final vote. The measure, as it now stands, would allow mayors or other local chief executives to declare states of emergency and set curfews and restrictions on the sale of firearms and liquor.

SUPPORTERS OF THE BILL to give states aid to parochial education are crying foul in the extracurricular debate over the controversial issue. The executive board of the Michigan Association of Secondary School Principals said "bigotry, intolerance, suspicion and hatred would be instilled in our young people" under the parochial educational system that would benefit from the bill.

MICHIGAN'S LAST CHANCE for a fair housing law before summer is now before the Legislature. The Senate State Affairs Committee reported out the measure last Wednesday, and with it came predictions that it would pass. Reporting it out of committee is an important step toward adoption. Bipartisan action accounted for it. The Senate is getting first chance at the bill because the House failed to adopt the proposal in a special session last year.

GOV. GEORGE ROMNEY acknowledged last week that New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller's willingness to accept a draft was a factor Romney considered when withdrawing from the primary race for the GOP presidential nomination.

DETROIT POLICE last week raided the Carlton Club, an alleged gambling club on the west side, and arrested 127 persons, including three persons who officers said were listed in a 1963 U.S. Senate subcommittee report on crime. One person was charged with maintaining and operating a gambling house; seven for keeping a gaming room for higher gain or reward and the rest for loitering in a place of illegal occupation. Police said the alleged gambling house ran a large dice and blackjack operation.

THE ALLEGED SANTA CLAUS bank bandit at Grant, Mich., Arthur C. Kass, 27, Ravenna, was sentenced to up to 10 years in prison last week by U.S. District Judge W. Wallace Kent in Kalamazoo. Federal authorities charged Kass, dressed in a Santa Claus suit, entered the Grant State Bank Dec. 20, 1967, carrying a shotgun, and ordered a teller to fill a box he carried with money. He stole \$11,915 which was mostly found. He pleaded guilty.

IN ANOTHER RULING, The Michigan Supreme Court has said that an unborn child is not a person within the meaning of Michigan's wrongful death act. The law provides for damages when a person is killed or injured by a wrongful act.

GENERAL MOTORS CORP., settled one strike last week at its parts depot in Van Nuys, Calif., only to find it had a new one develop at a depot in Cleveland.

CAPT. RAYMOND McCannell, commander of the state police detective division, said

a state of "public hysteria" exists. "A lot of people are going out and buying guns, and we think that's the worst thing they could do. The one thing worse than having the public unarmed is having people armed with guns they don't know how to use," he declared.

THE MICHIGAN SUPREME Court, by a 4-3 split decision, has upheld a State Appeals Court ruling that Gov. Romney does not have the power to name a probate judge to hear removal proceedings against Wayne County Sheriff Peter L. Bueback. A spokesman for Attorney General Frank Kelley said Kelley himself had to conduct the proceedings.

THE STATE COURT OF Appeals has ordered a new trial for a Hillsdale man convicted of felonious assault in the shooting of a plant guard during the 1964 Essex Wire Co. strike. The court ruled that Angelo LoPresto is justified in seeking a new trial on the basis of newly discovered evidence that could, in the judgment of the court, very probably result in a different result.

Michigan State University's College of Education works with 120 Michigan school districts in its teacher-training programs. During 1966-67, more than 2,200 MSU students participated in the programs.
