\$6,000 Scholarship Goes To FHS Student

William L. Spence, a 17-year-old Farmington High School student who investigated the quark theory of matter, has been named a \$6,000 scholarship winner in the Westinghouse Science Talent Search.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. William L. Spence, 31632 Marblehead, Farmington, Spence learned of his award at a banquet attended by 40 finalists in Washington, D.C. March 4.

He now ranks as one of the nation's most promising young scientists and has hopes to fulfill his promise at the California Institute of Technology. He wishes to do theoretical research in physics, particularly in the field of elementary particles.

It follows that Spence's favorite subjects at FHS are mathematics, chemistry and physics, but he also finds time to be a member of the Debate team.

He says he developed his cerebral interests over the past several years. Largely through outside-school study, he has become self-taught in quantum mechanics, relatively elementary particle theory and other aspects of theoretical physics.

It also follows that Spence's favorite light reading is what he calls "various physics journals."

"When I have time for them," he adds.

Oakland County newsdevelopments during recent days which are of interest to Farmington residents come from: FARMINGTON — An open housing ordinance, adopted by the city commission Jan. 30 but blocked from becoming effective by referendum petitions, will be submitted to a vote of the people June 24.

WEST BLOOMFIELD -- A three-mill tax proposal will go before township property owners March 25 in an effort to provide added township operating revenue. If adopted, the measure will provide extra funds for police protection, Township Supervisor John Doherty has stated that if the proposal is rejected, no police patrol cars will be available for night road duty. Township police records show breaking and entering cases have doubled in the past year.

ORCHARD LAKE -- Work has started on a project of laying a 700-foot pipeline from Cass Lake to Orchard Lake to raise the water level three feet. The undertaking is expected to be finished within two months.
