

FCC Delays Cut In Long Distance Phone Rates

WASHINGTON -- The Federal Communications Commission has put off for another three months a \$20 million cut in long distance telephone rates which had been planned for April 1.

The FCC said it was deferring the cut because of the uncertainty in settlement of a labor dispute involving the Bell system and because of a spending request for a surcharge in federal income tax.

At July 5, the FCC ordered the Bell system to reduce its long-distance charges by 50¢ million, but two months later decided to defer \$30 million of this to April 1, 1969.

WASHINGTON -- The Senate has voted to restrict the importation of woolen and man-made fabrics. This throws into

NEW YORK -- More than 160 idled ships have clogged the nation's biggest port as a longshoremen's strike dwindled fruit and foreign-car supplies and threatened to rot tons of perishable foods.

Luxury-liner passengers struggled with their own baggage and faced limited movement they said because of the difficulty getting provisions aboard ships without dock workers.

The cost of the strike of nearly 10,000 longshoremen is mounting at a \$3 million per day clip.

The strike is over the New

York-New Jersey Waterfront Commission's plan to open the work register to 750 men for new automated piers in New Jersey. The strikers say work has been diverted from New York to New Jersey piers, leaving the New York longshoremen underemployed or jobless.

ROCKFORD, Ill. -- A circuit court judge here said he will issue an injunction directing striking firemen to return to jobs. About half of the force, which totals 176, has been absent from each shift since Tuesday.

PITTSBURGH -- Four dissident steelworkers have filed suit in U.S. District Court to nullify the \$5 monthly steelworker union dues increase approved at the recent Atlantic

City convention.

Donald C. Rarick, who is running for the presidency of the United Steelworkers of America, and three other union members charged that the voting on the dues increase was rigged.

WASHINGTON -- The Civil Service Commission has announced an automatic cost-of-living increase in salaries to retired federal employees and their survivors. The 3.9 per cent increase, effective May 1, will show up on the June 1 checks of more than 800,000 on Civil Service retirement rolls.

WASHINGTON -- Military spending dropped in February by 10.6 per cent to just under \$6.2 billion, the Treasury reported.

At the same time, the department's monthly statement of income and outgo showed military spending for the first eight months of the fiscal year totaled \$50.23 billion.

WASHINGTON -- The U.S. Supreme Court has been urged to strike down laws that discriminate against illegitimate children, just as it has invalidated the laws that discriminate against Negroes.

The court heard arguments in two appeals involving the constitutionality of a Louisiana law that prohibits children born out of wedlock from recovering damages for the negligent deaths of their parents.

Louisiana courts have upheld the law on the ground that it "discourages" bringing children into the world out of wedlock.
