5 FCC Delays Cut In Long Distance Phone Rates

WASHINGTON - The Federal Communications Commission, has put off for another three mouths a \$20 million cut in long distance telephone rates which had been planned for Augrot 1.

The FCC said it was deferring the cut because of the uncertainty in settlement of a labor dispute involving the Bell system and because of a spending request for a surcharge in reduct income tax.

Like July 3, the FCC order following the Bell system to reduce its' long-distance charges by 120 million, but two months lared decided to defer \$30 million's of this to April 1, 1988.
