## Baker Bids To Renew Eel Control

State Rep. Raymond L. Baker GR-Farmington) has co-spond sored a resolution introduced in the Michigan Legislature asking Congress to reinstitute its program for the eradication of lamphrey cels in the Great Lakes.

Baker is chairman of the House Conservation and Re-creation Committee, and was joined in introducing the resol-ution by Charles H. Varnum, R-107th district.

They called the federal government's action in dropping the \$100,000 eradication program "false economy," and said it could have disastrous effects on Michigan's cohe salmon fishing.

"It will cost much more to re-start the program again when the lamphrey eels begin to over-run the Great Lakes once more," they declayed in the re-solution asking restoration of the control program.


