Kelley Hits Honigman's Judges Plan

In an Observer Newspapers interview in Plymouth, Kelley attacked the method proposed by the Honigman-led citizens' committee for panels which woulf nominate three judicial candidates, one of whom would be appointed by the governor. Kelley will debate Detrottat-torney Jason Honigman on the subject in a weekend television program. Although Kelley's forrhal speech hadn't been fin-shed at the time of the inter-
