

# NL Owners To Discuss Plans To Add Two Clubs

**The Sports World In Short:**  
Two big meetings, are on this weekend's agenda.

National League owners will assemble in Chicago to discuss expansion plans. The top will present ground rules to Montreal, Buffalo, Dallas-Fort Worth, Milwaukee and San Diego, two of which will be picked.

The American League will swell to 12 teams next year with the additions of Seattle and Kansas City. The National League says it will expand no later than 1971.

Meantime, the executive board of the Olympic Games will meet in Lausanne, Switzerland, to discuss the explosive South African situation. Forty-two nations have said they'll pass up the Games if South Africa competes.

The South Africans were invited back to the '68 Games at Mexico City if they field a multi-racial team.

VERBATIM, a Kentucky Derby favorite, scored his third straight stakes victory by winning the Gotham at Aqueduct by 2 1/2 lengths over Wise Exchange. The victory upped Verbatim's career earnings to \$100,586.

At Miami, Estreño II and Irish Rebellion finished in a dead heat in the Pan American

Handicap at Gulfstream.

**BOB COUSY**, the former great of the Boston Celtics, has ended rumors that he will step out as coach of basketball at Boston College. He'll return for the 1968-69 season.

In five seasons at Boston College, Cousy has directed the Eagles' to a record of 93

victories against only 34 losses.

**JOHN KUNDLA**, veteran basketball coach at the University of Minnesota, has announced he has coached his last game for the Gophers. Kundla, who got one time guided the Minnesota Lakers in the National Basketball Association, will remain at Minnesota as assistant to

the director of physical education after coaching the Gopher cagers for the last nine seasons. Bob Fitch, of Bowling Green U. has been named his successor.

**TRAGEDY STRUCK** the family of Dick LeBeau, a defensive back for the Detroit Lions. DeBeau's 10-year-old

daughter, Lisa, died in a Louisville hospital of leukemia.

**BASKETBALL COACH** René Herrera has followed abbaletti director Peig Newell (ex-Michigan State) in resigning at the University of California. Herrera was plagued by racial friction this past season after

he suspended center Bob Presley, a Negro.

Players asserted that the university administration forced the reinstatement, but Herrera's denied it.

**THE UNIVERSITY** of Michigan baseball team swept a pair from the University of Detroit, 7-5 and 3-0.

Michigan has a 3-10 overall record, Detroit 3-2. It's the worst start in history for a U-M nine. The Titans had lost to Michigan State, 5-1, and 13-1.

**FORMER MICHIGAN STATE** star Gene Washington, now an offensive end for the Minnesota Vikings in the National Football League, has been named an assistant director in MSU's Placement Bureau.

Washington will work at State from Jan. 1-July 15 while inactive from the gridiron.

Regionals, as well as the semifinals and finals, will be carried by the network.

**WALT ALSTON**, manager of the Los Angeles Dodgers, won't be able to handle his team for at least two more weeks. He's recovering in a Los Angeles hospital after undergoing a kidney operation.

**KALAMAZOO** — Last night in Westport Michigan, university baseball history came in 1959 when Phil Barile notched Florida State but lost the game, 2-0.

Leonard Hutchins, a Michigan AAU boxer representing the Detroit Parks and Recreation won the 1968 Golden Gloves 175-pound men's final for the next two National Championships.

Daugherty will hold a Green-White final game this spring as in the past.

He has announced that the Spartans will host two clinics for high school coaches — on May 4 for mentors in the Detroit area and a week later for outside mentors.

**ANN ARBOR** — The work of the offensive impressed Coach Bump Elliott as his Michigan football team ended spring drills Saturday with the Blue squad crushing the White, 42-21.

Quarterback Dennis Brown and Captain-halfback Ron Johnson led the Blue romp.

**BROWN ACCUMULATED** 136 yards in rushing and scored twice while Johnson, who performed guided over 1,000 yards last season, crunched over for a pair of touchdowns.

Brown ran six yards for the Blue's first TD before the White counted on dashes by sophomores Kirby Sams and Tom Kilina to go in front, 14-7.

Then Brown fired a five-yard scoring pass to John Abler, to tie the score.

Johnson scored just before halftime on a short sprint and the Blue lead went to 28-14 when sophomore Jim Dutcher grabbed a pass from Bill Harvath, another Blue.

Johnson and Brown, each counted once more to finish the rout.
