Mystery Hunt On In King Slaying

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Federal agents have been scouring this city for a man named Eric Starvo Galt, the mysterious object of a hunt linked with the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

What the agents have learned or what they want with Galt has been kept a tightly guarded secret. "No comment" is all the FBI will say. Not even the local police have been asked to help in Birmingham.

The name came up last Thursday on the Florida police teletype system from the FBI asking authorities to locate Galt. The message said Galt was driving a 1966 white Mustang hardtop with Alabama tag 1-18092.

The getaway car after Dr. King's murder April 4 was described by witnesses as a white Mustang with red and white license tags like Alabama's. However, what the FBI want Galt for is still a mystery.

WASHINGTON — World Bank President Robert S. McNamara prompted a demand Sunday that he resign as he broke the non-political tradition of his position to promote presidential candidate Robert F. Kennedy.

The demand came from Sen. Thurston B. Morton (R-Ky.) after Kennedy campaign headquarters released the text of a letter to the FBI in which the former secretary of defense praised Sen. Kennedy's role in the 1962 Cuban crisis.

Sen. Morton said that it was "undiscreet" for McNamara to allow his position to be used for domestic political infighting.

PALEMBACH, Fla. — John F. Kennedy Jr. and his big sister Caroline joined in an Easter egg hunt Sunday afternoon on the grounds of their grandfather's home. The former first lady, Jacqueline Kennedy, took the children after church to visit Joseph P. Kennedy, 79, former ambassador to England and father of the late president.

Merchants Urged To Follow Tips On Cashing Checks

By observing the following rules businessmen can make it more difficult for the professional operator to cash checks.

1. Be sure to ask for multiple identification.
2. Make a note of the identification offered and physical description of the passer, as M/N or M/W, 30, 5'6, 160, on the back of the check. Write the operator's name and/or car license number and state issued. Do not accept Social Security cards as total identification.
3. Do not cash checks that show signs of erasures or alterations.
4. Be sure that the item you cash is a check and not an advertising device or record voucher.
5. Do not cash checks that are not encoded with the account number. (Bottom line, center of check)
6. Do not cash checks for juveniles.
7. Make sure that the amounts shown on the check are the same.
8. Be wary of personal checks bearing unusually high sequence numbers.
9. Beware of checks far in excess of the amount of the purchase.
10. Do not accept postdated or "stale" checks. Do not accept checks that the passer asks to hold until a later date for cashing as he does not have sufficient funds presently on deposit.
11. Authenticity is not guaranteed because a check is stamped "CERTIFIED".
12. Because payroll checks on true or fictitious companies are frequently printed by the professional passer, treat all payroll checks with the same caution that you do personal checks.
13. Have the check endorsed in your presence. Even the check has already been endorsed, insist that it be endorsed again.
14. Do not let the passer hurry you.
15. If the maker's signature is not legible, ask for the spelling and print it below his name.
16. The person signing the check should mark it with his initials so that it (and the passer) can later be identified in court if necessary.
17. Report all check law violations to your local law enforcement agency.
18. Follow through with prosecution on all check cases after a complaint has been signed. Don't be "bought off."
19. Protect your blank checks, cancelled checks, check book statements from theft. Do not leave checks, etc., unattended or lying about indiscriminately.
20. Write your own checks in such a manner that they cannot be altered.
21. Know your endorser. You are NOT obligated to cash any check.

Kuhn On Naval Duty

Staff Sen. George W. Kuhn (R-West Bloomfield) has received military orders to report to the Navy Department in Washington, D.C., for two weeks active duty training.

Kuhn, who has served in both World War II (1945 to 1946) and the Korean conflict (1949 to 1952), has been active in the Naval Reserve for the past 25 years. He currently holds the rank of full commander and will go to Washington for training in his mobilization assignment as assistant director for weapons systems.

Kuhn will miss only a few days from his Senate duties, since the Senate will be in recess for Easter from April 18 through 22.

Livonia GI Is Wounded In Vietnam

24 David Klapp, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lev Klapp, 2491 Oakley, Livonia, has been wounded in action in Vietnam and currently is in a hospital in Tokyo.

Klapp was the information received by his parents Monday from the Department of Defense in Washington with additional news that he may be moved to a hospital in the United States shortly.

The communication indicated S/4 Klapp was struck by shrapnel during a battle in which 19 members of his company were killed and 40 wounded, including a sudden attack by Vietcong after dark.

S/4 Klapp was graduated from Bentley High in 1962 and had attended Schoolcraft College until drafted.
