NAACP Dinner Hosts Carl Stokes, Sammy Davis Jr.

The appearance of Carl B. Stokes, mayor of Cleveland, and entertainer Sammy Davis Jr., promises to assure that the 13th annual Detroit NAACP Freedom Fund Dinner, Sunday, April 28, will continue to rank as the largest NAACP fund-raising event in the country. Joseph C. Coles, chairman of the 1968 Freedom Fund Dinner, said this year's event already has outgrown Cobo Hall's ballroom capacity of 2,248. The 1968 Freedom Fund Dinner has been moved to the more spacious Exhibit Hall A in Cobo Hall.

COLES SAID he expects upwards of 3,000 persons to attend this year's \$100 a couple dinner. He said tickets may still be obtained at the Detroit Chapter office at 242 E. Warren or by phoning 531-5525.

Since its inception in 1955, the Detroit Freedom Fund Dinner has raised more than \$815,000 for the local and national units of the NAACP, the oldest civil rights organization in the United States.

COLES SAID the Detroit Freedom Fund Dinner, which has always had broad support from the white community, raised a record \$122,000 last year when 2,248 persons filled the Cobo Hall ballroom.

Stokes, who became the first Negro to be elected the mayor of a major city in the U.S., will be the main speaker. Davis, who is national life membership chairman of the NAACP, will be the guest artist at the April 28th dinner, which will begin at 5 p.m.

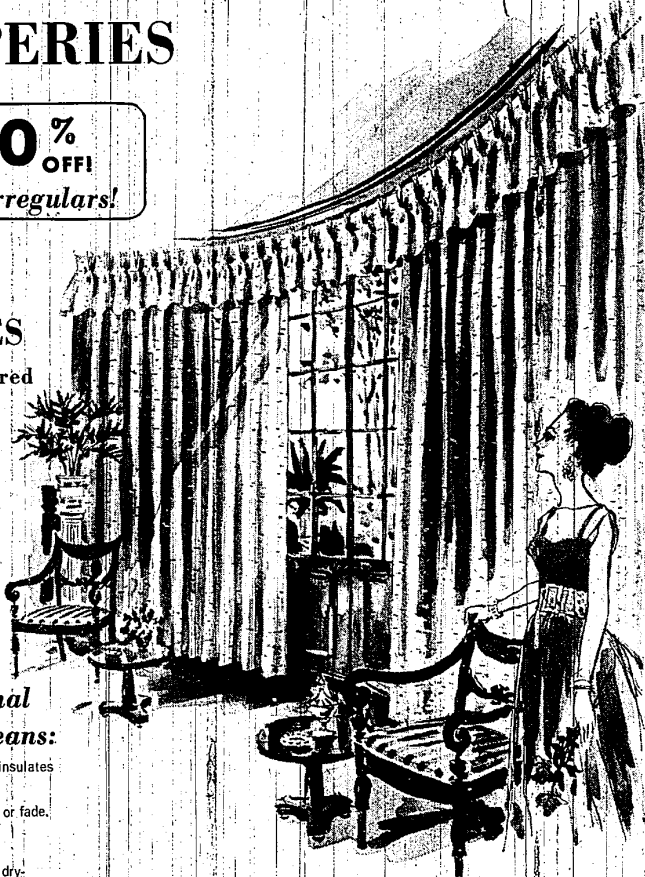
