Nature Trails Begun

Development of the long-discussed nature trail along the Rouge River in City Park will get underway April 20 when 100 or more Boy Scouts tackle the job of clearing the stream of its debris.

Scouts of Troops 14, 35 and 389 will work at the cleanup phase both Saturday and Sunday.

The following weekend, April 27 and 28, approximately 80 boys from Troops 45, 109, 161 and 167 will pick up where the earlier crews leave off in a "Scout Clean-up."

The job is scheduled for completion, May 4 and 5 by Scouts from Troops 118, 167 and 233.
