The Farmington Township Planning Commission will give formal consideration to Rezoning Request No. 114, a proposed amendment to the Farmington Township Zoning Ordinance which would rezone property described as follows from its present R-2 Single Detached District Classification to B-3 General Business District Classification.

A parcel of land in the NW 1/4 of Section 14, T2N, R2E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, described as: Beginning at a point on the north line of said 1/4 section, which is a distance 40.20 ft. S. 89 deg. 57 min. E. from the southwest corner of said section; thence along the north line of said section S. 89 deg. 57 min. E. 20.20 feet thence S. 89 deg. 05 min. E. 68.00 feet; thence N. 89 deg. 57 min. W. 121.82 feet thence along the westerly right-of-way of the Interstate Highway 20E Orchard Lake Road intersection north 88 deg. 47 min. 10 sec. West 202.00 feet thence north 5 deg. 21 min. West 114.00 feet to the point of beginning and containing 1.086 acres of land.

This property is located on Twelve Mile Road east of Orchard Lake Road. It is located on the West by the business property located at the 22nd corner of Orchard Lake Road and Twelve Mile Road, (Rochester Gas station and Siler's Market), on the North by Twelve Mile Road, and on the South by the Lake freeway. To the East of the property along Twelve Mile Road is the Forest Hills United Methodist Church. All property to the East of the proposed rezoning would continue in a single residential classification.

The proponent's present intention is to construct a funeral home upon this property.




