Quartet Faces Dope Charges

Four of eight Farmington Township youths charged by state police with illegal possession of marijuana have been freed on personal bond of \$1,000 each to await justice court preliminary examination April 24. The other four have been turned over to juvenile authorities. Standing mute before Waterford Justice of the Peace Patrick K. Daly, with innocent pleas automatically entered in their behalf were:
