### First American Cabinet.

When John Hancock was president of congress in 1789 and had his office at 5 Cherry street, in New York city, there were only three grand departments of the United States, which performed the functions now performed by the president's cabinet. These three grand departments were distributed as follows: The Hon. John Jay, secretary for foreign affairs, at 8 Broadway; Hon. Henry Knox, secretary of war, at 15 Smith street; the Hon. Walter Livingston, Samuel Osgood and Arthur Lee, commissioners of the treasury. The "office of congress" in that period was at 81 Broadway. When Washington was first elected president in 1789 there were four members of congress from New York as follows: John Lawrence, John Hartung, Melancthon Smith and Peter W. Yates.

### Girls Do the Courting.

Philippine natives believe in certain forms of women's rights, especially when it comes to choosing a husband. For instance, the Bontoc Igorrotes leave all the courting to the girls.
