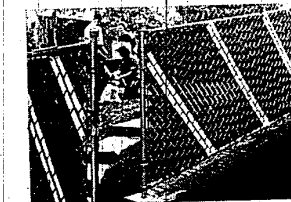

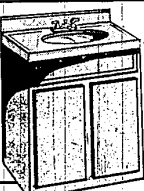

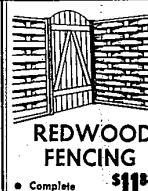

Rocky Busy For Man Who 'Isn't In Race'

ALBANY — New York Gov. Nelson Rockefeller's campaign for the Republican presidential nomination is off and running. Next month, the governor will travel through more than a dozen states discussing the Republican national platform with the voters and party leaders. He will be acting in his capacity as chairman of the GOP Governor's special committee and it will also give the exposure a candidate needs.

ST. AUGUSTINE — Thirteen of 31 persons were hospitalized over the weekend when chlorine gas escaped from a ruptured tank. They were reported to be in good condition. All the victims had trouble taking and severe abdominal pains. The gas was sucked into the air-conditioning system of a supermarket jammed with weekend shoppers.

Michigan Bell customers may have lost service because of the seven cable cuts. Each cable was reported to have carried 2,100 lines. Company supervisors repaired the breaks.

NEWARK — Fire Director John Caulfield has ordered an around-the-clock investigation of a fire that roared through a five-block area in the city's heavily Negro Central Ward last weekend, destroying 34 houses and leaving some 500 persons homeless. Caulfield said the fire was the worst in the history of Newark and was "definitely suspicious."

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service has served notice to political candidates that they must pay taxes on funds diverted to personal use from political contributions.

National News Round Up

WASHINGTON — The United States Supreme Court looks a new look at the First Amendment Monday in the context of a New York law that requires public school systems to lend textbooks to students in parochial schools. Two school boards, one in Albany and one in Long Island are asking the court to strike down the three-year-old law as in violation of the amendment's religious clauses.

and testimonial dinners. The IRS directive spelled out specifically what funds raised from political sources can be taxed, while it did not indicate any new policy. It was the first time all IRS rulings on political fund raising had been put together in one place.

DALLAS — Representatives of the 10.3-million-member Methodist Church and the 740,000-member Evangelical United Brethren Church met Monday in Texas and joined the two bodies together to form a single sect of more than 11-million members—the United Methodist Church. They both share common spiritual and doctrinal traditions, going back to colonial times. The biggest difference between the two has been language—the Brethren spoke German while the larger church spoke English. The language difference has long since disappeared.

PRINCETON — Princeton University trustees have yielded to a student threat of a mass dormitory sit-in with girl friends and relaxed the rule governing night-time visits by guests. The change allows girls to remain in the rooms of all-male schools 2,200 under 18 students until 10 p.m. on weekdays and until 2 a.m. on weekends. Previously girls had been banned from dormitory rooms after 7 p.m. on weekdays and after midnight on weekends.

WASHINGTON — The AFL-CIO Communications Workers of America said Sunday that court injunctions obtained by the Bell Telephone System blocked any immediate progress toward settling the union's four-day-old nationwide walkout of nearly 200,000 telephone workers. Joseph Byrne, CWA president, said, "It sets us back just at a time when the first sign of a breakthrough had appeared."

MEMPHIS — A ranking Memphis police officer acknowledges there are "a whole lot of discrepancies" in official descriptions of the men sought as the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Asst. Chief Bill Price referred to the suspect as "James Earl Ray, 40, an escaped Mississippi convict, and Eric Starvo Galt—first sought for King's murder—are the same person." "You don't know what to look for," Price said as officials elsewhere continued their investigation of the slaying. The nationwide manhunt continues.

GREENWOOD — A tornado that devastated this western Kansas town Friday, killed at least 13 persons, police said, as the search for additional victims resumed. More than 270 persons were treated for injuries, either at hospitals in nearby Fort Smith or in an emergency medical center in the library in Greenwood. The tornado swooped out of a spring thunderstorm at 3:23 p.m. and slammed into the business district, leveling about half of the buildings on the town square and heavily damaging most of the others.

CLEVELAND — A 15-year-old boy died Monday in Mount Sinai Hospital after he was shot in the head by a policeman. Police said Patrolman Robert Livingston shot Donald Wiley during a chase earlier on the east side. Police said Officer Livingston wanted to question Wiley and another youth about a stolen record player. The other youth was overruled and arrested after dropping the record player.

LANSING — Seven more telephone cables were severed over the weekend—all in the Lansing area. State Police and the FBI probed the latest cable-cutting incidents, along with the severing of a cable on Friday. Police said that as many as 15,000
