U.S. Senate subcommittee issued a report on migrain labor
that said much the same thing:
"Despite their vital role in
modern agriculture, particu-larly in filling the crucial needs
at harvestime, our migrant cit-leans have been grossly neglected by society."

MORE OFTEN THAN not, in addition to low living standards, the influx of migrants to supplement local labor forces creates problems in the areas of health, education, sanitation and housing which the community is not equipped to meet. "The statistics ... indicating, maintritino, disease and lack of education, poor housing, maintritino, disease and lack of adequate medical and entil care tell only part of the story of the shocking degree of impover/shiment of the migrant."

By mid-summer, more than a million of these migrants will be on the move, picking foods and vegetables from coast to coast.

minimally included" in workerbenefit legislation, both federal
and state.
