



McDonald To Address Rice Memorial Seminar

Rice Memorial Methodist Church will sponsor a Law and Order Day from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Saturday, May 4.

Three seminars, all open to the public, will feature Congressman Jack McDonald, representative from the 11th district, Lt. Michael Masong of the Redford Township Police Department, and attorney James Lafferty.

The Rev. Paul Frederick, pastor of Rice Memorial, said the day was planned "in recognition of a need for further information concerning several vital issues of our day."

REP. McDONALD will address the morning seminar, which will follow an opening coffee hour.

His talk, titled "The Citizen's Role in Government," will relate to the problem of communicating ideas to the centers of government power. A small group discussion and a question and answer period will follow his address.

TWO AFTERNOON seminars will follow the pot-luck sandwich luncheon.

Lt. Masong will speak on "The Citizen's Role in Law Enforcement," bringing in such

maters as crime, the auxiliary police force, drugs and riot prevention, and in that seminar too there will be discussion and questions and answers. The officer has been with the township police for 11 years.
