Love For A Horse Ends In Her Death

Injuries suffered April 20 by 14-year-old Sandra Cischke, who was dragged by a pet horse for more than a quarter of a mile, proved fatal. The Farmington Junior High School eighth grader died Thursday in Botsford General Hospital after regaining consciousness from the accident.

which climaxed her final outing with an animal she had grown to adore in the two years she cared for him. Sandra was walking the horse down Lamar Rd. near her Farmington Township home 12 days before her death when the animal suddenly bolted and started racing westward toward Orchard Lake Rd. Sandra's affection for the horse had led her into one mistake. She had tied the reins around her waist, and when her friend became mysteriously frightened he dragged the young girl more than two blocks until finally stopped by a neighbor.
