## News Round Up

LANSING -- Petitions to put the American Independent rty, which supports former Alabama Gov. George Wallace president, on the November ballot in Michigan were filed Lansing Friday. The group needs at least 13,371 yalld sig-rures to qualify as a party and an affidavit filed with the filtons claimed there were signatures of 32,101 registered ers.

LANSING -- Michigan Democrats have announced that Vice President Hubert Humphrey will visit Lansing, and De-troit May 14. Humphrey will address a joint beassing of the Michigan Legislature in the morning and a Democratic Party Century Club fund-rating reception in the evening, Both of the other announced Democratic presidential candidates, New York Sen. Robert Kennedy and Minnesota Sen. Eugene Mc-Carthy already have visited the state.

WASHINGTON -- G. Mennen Williams, nominated by President Johnson to be ambassador to the Philippines, was examined Friday by the Senate Foreign Relations Cammittee. Chairman J. 


