need two feet between the plaints and three feet between rows. If they are not staked, allow three or more in each direction for them to sprawl.

Corn should be planted so the plaints are a root spart and the rows are 2 1/2 feet apart. Radishes, leaf lettice, green onichs, swiss chard, spinach, peas, carrots and beet scan be plainted in rows 12 to 18 inches spart.

Choose a spot for the garden that gets full sun. Vegetables just will not grow in the shade, A plot 40 feet by 60 feet will supply all the vegetables that a family of six can eat with plenty to share with friends, or to put in the freezer. Even a tiny plot a few feet square can be used for a salad garden. Cabbage, brocolli, cauli-flower, and most other vege-tables are set two to three feet apart.
