Glick Ceramics On View

An exhibition of ceramics by John Parker Glick and ceramic sculpture by his wife, Ruby Glick, both of Farmington's Plain Tree Pottery on 10 Mile Rd., will be held May 28 through June 25 in the Allen Rubiner Gallery, 621 S. Washington, Royal Oak.

Hours for viewing will be 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

One of Michigan's most outstanding potters, Glick holds a master of fine arts degree from Cranbrook Academy of Art. He was a ceramics instructor at Wayne State University in 1966 and at the Bloomfield Art Association from 1964 to 1967.

He has exhibited since 1960 and in 1961 was awarded a Tiffany Grant for independent study. He is represented in the collections of the Detroit Institute of Art, University of Michigan, Cranmer Art Museum and Wayne State University.

Summer school for 17 North Farmington High students will be an exciting time because they will spend it at the University of Dijon in France.

Mrs. Miriam Hall, NFH French instructor, has been appointed by the American Institute for Foreign Study to accompany the students on their six-week European study tour which will begin the latter part of June.

Mrs. Hall and the students will leave by Trans Airline chartered jet from New York's Kennedy Airport on June 23 for London. They will spend three days in London and one in Cambridge, stopping en route for Ostend, France, to visit Runnymede and Stonehenge. From Ostend, they will drive to Dijon, visiting Brussels and Belgium en route.

The University of Dijon is considered one of the finest in France. One of its special features is "Dinanche a la Campagne," or "Sunday in the country." For this, each student is assigned to spend one of his Sundays with a typical French family of Dijon.

After four weeks at Dijon, the Farmington contingent will drive to Paris where they will spend three days visiting various landmarks.

The group will embark for home on Aug. 12 from Le Bourget Airport.

Oakland County Roundup

News events during the past week in Oakland County include:

NOVI—The Village Council will explore a proposal of changing the village ordinance to raise the minimum lot size requirements from 7,500 square feet to be discussed at a joint meeting of the village council and the village planning board on May 13.

NORTHVILLE—The Northville City Council has voted to hold a public hearing on an open housing ordinance. The proposed ordinance would provide for a penalty of not more than 90 days in jail and/or a fine not to exceed \$500 if enacted.

WEST BLOOMFIELD—Mrs. Robert B. DuPre has been appointed clerk of the township. She will take office May 16 replacing Mrs. Doris O. Leach, who has resigned for personal reasons. The post pays \$10,000 a year.

WATERFORD—Voters approved a 15-mil renewal for the schools by a 3-1 margin May 6. The vote followed a November defeat for a seven and a half mil increase in the district. The 15 mils will be levied through 1985.

COUNTY—Total valuation of Oakland County is up \$460 million from last year according to figures released by the County Treasurer's office. The 16 per cent growth came from the reassessment of property throughout the county.
