Woodcroft Sewers Completed

Sewer lines in the Woodcroft Subdivision in the newly annexed portion of the City of Farmington were completed Monday. The water lines are expected to be completed in a month barring additional work stoppage because of weather or work conditions.

Theodore E. DeBane, Director of Public Services in the City, explained the next step for the residents of the area.

Individuals must hire their own contractor to bring the sewer and water facilities into their own homes, he explained. In the case of the sewer lines the contractor is required to take out the necessary permits from the building department in city hall.

"Cost of these documents is \$35 with an extra \$10 assessed if a septic tank must be bypassed.

The cost for tapping into the water line is \$140 plus an \$18 charge for a remote dial and this includes a water meter. The city will do the actual work to bring the water line to the property line, but the private contractor must build the rest of the line.

DeBane recommended that if the residents can wait to have the construction work done all at one time, "The contractor can dig one hole for both water and sewer lines," he said.

Estimated time for the work in each case should be about one day.
