With an angry flash in her eyes, she comments, "When I was working with the Red Cross, I used to really make me mad when I would call some of these housewives to do a job and have them say, 'What's in it for me,' Can you imagine that?"

WITH HER nursing duties and her husband's council activities, nobody in the Yoder household has much free time these days, but with her thoughts on what constitutes worthwhile effort, Maggie, Margie, Fern Yoder is sure to be in the fighting line any volunteer jobs come along.
