Call In Army To Quell Riots In Maryland

SALISBURY, Md. — The shooting of a Negro burglary suspect touched off racial violence which resulted in a call-up of the Maryland National Guard to prevent further trouble. The Guard was ordered into active service Sunday by Gov. Spiro T. Agnew, who said the move was mainly a precautionary measure. Several hundred state troopers quelled a disturbance by about 1,000 Negroes Saturday night after the burglary suspect was shot by a white policeman.

MIAMI BEACH — Dorothy (Dad) Ansett of Kirkland, Wash., was crowned Saturday night in the 17th annual Miss USA pageant. Miss USA, who is an English major at the University of Washington, is 20 and has measurements of 40-25-36. First runner-up in the pageant was Miss Maryland, Paulette Reck.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — Gov. Otto Kerner resigned from office Sunday to become a judge on the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Chicago. He turned over the chief executive post to Lil Gov. Samuel H. Shapiro, also a Democrat.

PITTSBURGH — Dr. George Wallace of Pittsburgh's Carnegie Institute says that this is the month and the year the 17-year locusts can be expected to swing into action. "Actually," he explained, "there isn't much to worry about." The locusts only shred the bark of the trees where they lay their eggs.

MORRISTOWN, N.J. — John F. Kennedy, Jr., son of the late President Kennedy, fractured his left wrist when he fell off a pony last weekend. The boy, 7, was treated and released from a local hospital.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The Riverside Jaycees, a chapter at the Tennessee state prison, was named outstanding chapter of the state this weekend at the Tennessee state Jaycee convention. The three Jaycees receiving top honors are serving terms of time.

NEW YORK — Time, Inc., has agreed to loan \$5 million to the Curtis Publishing Co., which produces the Saturday Evening Post, in a plan to reduce Curtis' large financial losses in recent years. The program calls for cutting the Post's circulation to less than half its current 6.8 million, with Post subscribers allowed to receive Life magazine instead. Under the loan agreement, Time will advance Curtis \$5 million in July and another \$2.5 million in September. Curtis has been publishing The Saturday Evening Post since 1897.

WASHINGTON — FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover has said that revolutionary stands taken by militant black nationalist groups and students of the new left pose a threat to the nation's security. He told Congress the black nationalist groups he had in mind were the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, the Black Muslims and the Revolutionary Action Movement.

MALIBU, Calif. — Actor Terence Stamp was released on bail after his arrest last weekend on suspicion of marijuana possession.

GARY, Ind. — The Gary Board of Education is facing the second week of student boycotts which have kept as many as 40 per cent of the system's children out of school. The boycott is organized by a citizens group which is asking for a new superintendent more sympathetic to the group, integration in all schools, and more federal money for the city's schools.

National News Round Up

CHICAGO — A booby trap backfired and sent Marshall Edwards, 25, to the hospital last weekend. He had rigged a shotgun to his bedroom closet after thieves had entered the apartment three times. But Marshall forgot about the device Saturday and opened the door, receiving a blast in his chest.

WASHINGTON — Reconciliation City, the encampment of the poor in Washington, is growing by leaps and bounds. The population of the campsite was estimated at 1,500 after the weekend by Southern Christian Leadership Conference officials. More than 400 six-to-eight-person plywood huts have already been completed, and several more are under way. Caravans from the far west are due in Washington about Friday. Organizers expect to have 4,500 to 5,000 people housed by Memorial Day, target date for a huge demonstration.

WASHINGTON — Vice President Hubert Humphrey has said that he would win the Democratic presidential nomination if the convention were held this week. He added: "I think we're that far out in front. But the convention isn't tomorrow — it's not until August. There will be a great deal of tugging and pulling and persuading between now and then."

WASHINGTON — Gov. Nelson Rockefeller says that he is "open-minded" about a Rockefeller-Reagan Republican ticket, but he thinks right now that Gov. Reagan is aiming for the top spot himself.

WASHINGTON — Sen. Russell B. Long (D.-La.) said it is hardly possible that the third-party candidacy for former Alabama Gov. George Wallace will throw the election of a president into the House of Representatives.
