**Car Boom  
May Pass  
'65-Ford**

BOSTON — Auto industry sales are going at a rate which even surprises Detroit optimists, a Ford Motor Company executive said here today.

"We may be on our way to a record year in automobile sales," M.S. (Matt) McLaughlin, Ford vice president and Lincoln-Mercury Division general manager, told the Massachusetts Automobile Dealers Association.

The biggest auto year in history was 1965, when 9.3 million U.S. and foreign cars were sold.

"I'M SURE YOU ALL know that the market is strong," he said, "and just how strong may surprise even the optimists. Industry sales in March—and I'll concede that sales contests inflated the total a bit—hit 947,000 units for an annual rate of better than 9.5 million.

March sales this year actually were more than 100,000 units ahead of the same month in 1967, which gives us some idea of the terrific bounce we are experiencing."

McLaughlin warned the dealers that while the auto market continues to grow, it also continues to change and dealers must adjust their operations accordingly.

CHIEF AMONG the challenges of the future will be dealers' physical capacity to accommodate a 25 per cent increase in new and used car sales which is anticipated in the 1970s, he stated.

Other challenges are the changes which occur in local trading areas and traffic routes, the increasing complexity of automobiles and the resultant need for better tools and service technicians, the popularization of leasing and daily rentals and the proliferation of new models.

Delivery**

RICHMOND, Va. — Seventy years ago the world thrilled to the feat of Lt. Andrew S. Rowan of the U.S. Army who sent word to U.S. command forces in the Spanish-American War that he had successfully delivered his "message to Garcia."

Garcia was Cuban rebel Gen. Calixto Garcia and the message Rowan had delivered to him in his stronghold deep in the Cuban mountains was that the United States had joined him in his war against Spain.

AN IRONIC postscript to that historic incident was written here recently when a Richmond man was hurt in an accident and rushed to the emergency room of St. Mary's Hospital for treatment.

"What's your name?" asked the nurse who came to his aid.

"Carlos Garcia-Velez," he replied.

"Do you spell 'Garcia' the way it's spelled in 'a message to Garcia'?" she asked.

"Yes," the Garcia who received the message was his great-grandfather," he said.

"Well," said the surprised nurse, Mrs. Regina Rowan Hols, "the man who carried the message to your grandfather was my father's cousin."

**U-M Prof  
Picked For  
Housing Study**

WASHINGTON — A University of Michigan faculty member is among 23 persons appointed to a new national panel on housing problems of the elderly.

The group, known as the Advisory Committee on Housing for Senior Citizens, was appointed by Secretary Robert C. Weaver of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The U-M committee member is Dr. Wilma Donahoe, chairman of the division of gerontology, Institute of Human Adjustment.

The Very Rev. Msgr. W.L. Suedkamp, secretary for charities, archdiocese of Detroit, was also named.

Members will serve for one year and may be reappointed, Secretary Weaver said. They include educators, public officials, builders, doctors, sociologists, clergymen, labor leaders, attorneys and businessmen.

The first committee meeting will take place in Washington.
