



BOSTON — Auto Industry cales are going at a rate which even surprises Detroit optimists, a Ford Motor Compair, accounts and bare today.

"We may be on our way to a record year in automobile sales," M.S. (Mat) McLaughall, Ford vice president and Lincoin-Mercury Division general manager, told the Massachissetts Automobile Dealers Association.

The biggest auto year in history was 1965, when 9.5 million U.S. and foreign cars were sold.
