LANSING -- Longtime Michigan state Sen. Frank D. Beadle (R-St. Clair) has announced that he will resign from the Senate this year, ending nearly 18 years of legislative service. As chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, the 69-year-old Beadle has been one of the chief custodians of state money.

ANN ARBOR -- Classes at Ann Arbor High School were called off Monday after a Friday confrontation between Negro students and the school's

administration. The students had refused to attend classes Friday, protesting a curriculum questionnaire directed only at Negro students. On Monday, the administration met with protesting student groups to discuss possible changes at the school. Classes resumed Tuesday.

LANSING -- A bill which would exempt all but two state legislators from Lansing's one per cent income tax has been defended by its sponsor as a

is exemption from taxes mentioned. The bill would specify that the place of employment for state legislators is in their home district, and not in Lansing.

LANSING -- An effort of the State Highway Department to reduce the number of regulatory and informational signs that may confuse drivers on high-speed freeways will soon result in a vanishing act for many road-side signs. Such signs as speed limit, emergency stopping only, keep off medians and destination that have been posted after each entrance will disappear. "We feel once a motorist gets on the freeway he knows what the speed limits are and what his destination is," says Harold H. Cooper, chief of the Traffic Safety Division.

ANN ARBOR -- Two brothers

from Jackson are showing rapid recovery after a successful kidney transplant at University Hospital. The donor, Wayne Swank, Jr., was discharged from the hospital last weekend. Wayne's right kidney was given to his younger brother Carl in a three-hour operation May 17.

WASHINGTON -- According to a report by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Michigan ranked fifth in fishing license holders and second in hunting license holders in the 1967 national tallies.

DETROIT -- General Motors Corp. has hinted that it, too, may raise prices tags on 1969 models distributed this fall. GM's hint came at the annual meeting in a comment by James Roche, chairman, who said that costs are going up and the company's ability to absorb them "is questionable." Chrysler Corp. and Ford Motor Co. have already indicated that they are considering a price rise for fall.

MILAN -- A falling tree limb crushed and killed a 28-year-old Milan mother Monday morning while her five-year-old son watched from a parked car. Mrs. Virginia Norris was driving on a road near her home when her car was halted by a large tree limb and two parked cars in the roadway. Mrs. Norris had left the car to assist the other drivers in removing the limb when she was hit by a second falling limb.

LANSING -- An anti-riot bill which imposes stiff penalties for urging a person to commit any crime was passed by the House last week, after it had been heavily amended and passed by the Senate. The bill had originally been aimed at those who urge violence and destruction during a riot, but was expanded to include advocating any crime. The House version of the measure defines "criminal solicitation" as urging another person to commit a crime with intent to cause its commission and where there is a "clear and present danger" that it will be committed.

LANSING -- The Senate last week first passed, then reconsidered and killed a bill which would have set up binding and compulsory arbitration procedures for police and fire-fighter contract disputes. The proposal was first passed by a vote of 20-19, then later defeated, 17-16.
