The Detroit Red Wings have landed the veteran defenseman they've been seeking.

They obtained Bobby Baum, 31, from the Oakland Seals in a six-player deal as a forerunner to announcing next Monday that Bill Gadsby will be coming to the Wings' new coach.

Sid Abel, who's stepping down as coach to devote full duty to being the general manager, also got Ron Harris, a forward, from the Seals in exchange for defenseman Howie Young, forwards Gary Jarrott and Doug Roberts and an unnamed Red Wing amateur player.

"We gave up youth," said Abel, "but we had to in order to tighten our defense."

Both Jarrott and Roberts are 25. Roberts came out of Cooley High in Detroit to make the Wings.

Harris is a product of the Wings' system and played defense in the Detroit organization.

"We plan to try him there next season," Abel said.

But Baum is the big name in the deal for Detroit. He's a 12-year National Hockey League veteran who spent 11 years with the Toronto Maple Leafs before going to Oakland as the Seals' No. 1 pick in last year's expansion draft.

Fern Flamanov, along with Gadsby, have been rumored as the top candidates for the Wings' coaching post. But all signs indicate that Gadsby has the job locked up.
