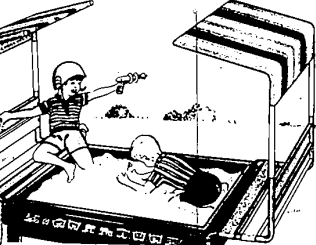

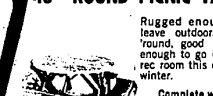

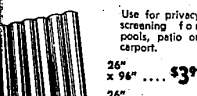

Nuclear Sub Missing With 99 On Board

WASHINGTON -- The nuclear-powered U.S. submarine Scorpion is reported overdue at sea with 99 aboard. The Defense Department said the Scorpion had been scheduled to return to Norfolk, Va., at 1 p.m. Monday after a routine training operation. A massive search of the Atlantic is underway, using submarines, surface ships and aircraft of the Atlantic fleet. The Pentagon reported that the Scorpion was last heard from last Tuesday, noting that "it is normal for a submarine making a submerged passage to observe radio silence for extended periods."

National News Round Up

12 hours before returning the verdict against the now-debunked publisher, publisher Ralph Glasburg and former managing editor Warren Boroson, Harris Steinberg, attorney for Glasburg, said the result would be appealed.

The suit attracted wide attention because many legal authorities felt it could lead to establishing new guidelines in libel cases involving public figures.

MEMPHIS -- Sixty passengers in an amusement park skyride got more excitement than they bargained for Saturday night when tornado-force winds snarled a cable on the ride, and safety devices brought the 25 tiny gondolas to a halt.

All but 20 were rescued by fire ladders, but the remaining youngsters and a few adults, who were stranded over a lake, spent the night on the ride.

They were brought down early Sunday morning after the cables were repaired. Only three were hospitalized for treatment of shock.

MIAMI -- Terrorists, with explosives and tear gas, struck Sunday at three locations in Miami's Little Havana section. A hotel, the home of the Mexican consul and a supper club were the targets.

Police said one person was taken to a hospital for minor injuries. Tear gas was dropped onto a dance floor, breaking up a ball for 250 persons. At about the same time, an explosive went off in front of the home of Mexican Consul Rafael Reyes Spindola. Guests at the supper club were routed by tear gas fumes.

Exiles say the attacks are in protest of what they believe to be support for Fidel Castro's Cuban government. Several arrests have been made in connection with the bombings.

WASHINGTON -- A full-swing movement into non-violent demonstrations was announced for this week by the Rev. Ralph Abernathy at Russell City. The mud-swamped encampment dried out considerably after a weekend of warm, sunny weather.

In announcing stepped-up demonstrations, the Rev. Abernathy added: "Now civil disobedience, of course, would come as a last result. It may be that we will have to resort

CLEVELAND -- Delegates to the Unitarian Universalist Association's general assembly voted in favor of granting recognition and funds to a Negro controlled Unitarian group.

Known as the Black Affairs Council, the group is to get \$250,000 a year--12 1/2 per cent of the association's annual budget--for four years. The money will be used "to alleviate racism in society."

CLEVELAND -- Cleveland's 370 city truck drivers went on strike last Friday for more money, and Mayor Carl B. Stokes said he won't negotiate until they return to work. The walkout started when many of the garbage and rubbish workers called in sick.

Picket lines were set up at city garages, and other workers declined to cross. Mayor Stokes said the driver's action was an "unauthorized strike and work stoppage." He said no strikers would receive sick benefits.

It was estimated that rubbish would pile up in the city at the rate of 1,000 tons a day.

ATHENS, O. -- "Significant structural changes" at Ohio University are the goals of about 2,500 students who held a mass meeting Friday and proclaimed the establishment of a "freedom university" to help promote their cause. Members of the group are seeking support for establishment of a grievance procedure with the school administration.

ATHENS, O. -- Three students were sent to hospital after three successive accidents in an elevator shaft at Ohio University's new library, which is still under construction.

One student heard moans coming from inside and went in to investigate. He fell into the shaft, landing on top of a young man who had tumbled into the shaft sometime earlier.

A third student later entered the building and fell into the shaft, also falling on top of the other two. All were taken to the University's Medical Center, and one of the boys, George R. Brown, Jr., is in critical condition.
