Complete 180th Church Assembly

After taking action on evangelism, social issues, church management, commissioners to the 180th General Assembly of the United Presbyterian Church have returned from Minneapolis to implement assembly decisions in local churches and judicatories.

Thirty-eight clergymen and elders from the Synod of Michigan participated in the deliberations.

The assembly, May 16-22, recommended de-escalation of the Vietnam war and urged a settlement recognizing the essential interests of all parties. It condemned indiscriminate means of warfare.

Action was taken in the report on urban crisis condemning "racial police behavior" in the ghetto with a warning against repressive white action to block unrest. Boards and agencies were directed to reorient priorities in the use of funds and staff in crisis programs and to develop suburban action centers.

Reginald D. McChesney, Detroit, was chairman of the committee on crisis in the cities.

Detroit To Host Four-Day Ecumenical Workshop
The Fifth National Workshop for Christian Unity will be held in Detroit June 10-20 a world ecumenical leader, a Lutheran expert on Catholicism and a Catholic authority on Martin Luther.
The four-day consultation, hosted by Archbishop John F. Dearden and the Commission for Ecumenical Affairs of the Archdiocese of Detroit, is expected to draw an audience upwards of 2,000 from the United States and Canada.
The world ecumenical leader is Dr. Eugene Carson Blake, general secretary of the World Council of Churches, who will discuss at a Wednesday evening session, June 19, session at Cobo Hall "The World Movement for Christian Unity."
The Lutheran authority is Dr. Martin E. Marty, of the Department of Theological Studies of the University of Chicago, who will present "A Protestant Critique of Extremism in Catholic Renewal" before a June 19 morning audience.
Dr. Frank J. McSorley, CSP, professor of ecumenism at St. Paul's College, Washington, D.C., will speak on "Martin Luther and His Protestant Modern Ecumenical Evaluation," at opening ceremonies Sunday evening, June 16, at Detroit's Ford Auditorium.
He will be joined on the platform by Dr. R. H. Edwin Espy, general secretary of the National Council of Churches, speaking on "The Future of Ecumenism -- Its Hopes and Fears."
MONDAY, JUNE 17, Dr. Eugene Burke, CSP, professor of theology at St. Paul's College, will address "Where Are We Today? -- A Survey of Theological Dialogue."
Two speakers will appear on the 11 a.m. Monday program. They are Fr. Bernard Law, executive director of the U.S. Bishops' Committee for Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Affairs, and Mrs. Theodore O. Wedel, associate general secretary, Division of Christian Unity, the National Council of Churches.
The will discuss, respectively, Catholic and Protestant perspectives in "Christian Unity Efforts in America Today."
At a 2:30 p.m. Workshop there will be reports from participants in national Catholic-Lutheran, Catholic-Presbyterian,
