In Preview

A screening of three new half-hour films, sponsored by the United Nations Association of Metropolitan Detroit, will be presented at the Reynolds Building Auditorium, 16000 Northland Drive, Southfield, on June 4th at 8 p.m.

The screening, showing various aspects of the work of the United Nations, is being presented both for UN members and for representatives of other organizations who would like to preview these films in the course of planning future programs about the U.N.

"The World at U.N. Plaza" provides an inside look at the work of the U.N. Mission to the U.N. and behind-the-scenes diplomacy during last summer's Middle East crisis.

"Man Alive," narrated by Alec Guinness, shows the efforts of the World Health Organization to eliminate disease and improve sanitary conditions around the globe.

"The Minds of Men" is a world-circling survey of UNESCO activities, focusing on teacher training, oceanography and the preservation of cultural landmarks.
