Under Knotts, Thurston built individual and earn champs. He promoted the sport so that he ivaled basketball and swimming on the winter program and attracted big crowds.

The team has reigned in the Northwest Sub-urban League as mat champs since the circuit was iormed some seven years ago. Thurston has won two regional titles and fin-ished second five times. The Townshippers reg-ularly have placed among the leaders in the state meet.
