

On this silver anniversary year of harness racing at Northville Downs drivers took time out in the paddock to pause and talk of the humble beginning of this pioneer partnership meeting in 1944.

"I think there were 25 head on the grounds that night when the first eight-race card was run," mused the veteran Tommy Winn. "I recall how they went out to the farms and talked owners, into entering their horses just to fill out the programs."

"YOU KNOW somewhere in my home over on Merriman Road, I've got some old Northville programs which would answer many of your questions."

It wasn't long before there were 150 head stabled at Northville and stable space was at a premium that many horses were stabled in tents.

That first meeting a \$20,000 handle a night was a rarity and a crowd of 2,000 was considered excellent.

It's Official: Name Gadsby Wings' Coach

The new coach of the Detroit Red Wings is Bill Gadsby.
A 20-year playing veteran of the National Hockey League, Gadsby was appointed to the post Monday by Red Wings' President Bruce A. Norris.

Gadsby succeeds Sid Abel, who is giving up the coaching duties to concentrate on his job as general manager. Abel has been Detroit's coach since mid-season of 1957-58 and has held the dual position of general manager and coach since 1962.

"Bill is my personal choice," Norris said. "He is the man I've wanted from the start. Sid Abel endorses this choice 100 per cent and I think he and Bill will give us the best leadership in the National League."

Gadsby, 40, retired in 1966 after playing the final five years of his NHL career with the Red Wings.

DURING THE 1965 season, he and Gordie Howe became the second and third men in league history to play 20 years. (Phil Clapper of Boston was the first.)

Only the sixth coach in Red Wings' 42 year history, Gadsby is recognized as one of the greatest defencemen in NHL annals. His name is inscribed in the League's record book at least a dozen times.
