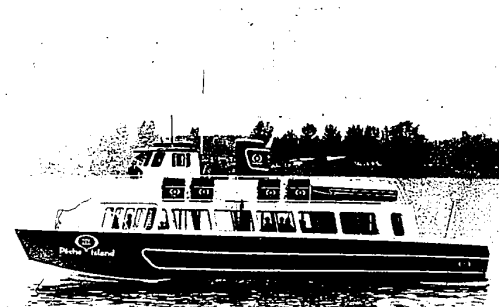

Peche Island Ferries Back After 26 Years

Dedication of the new 200-passenger Peche Island ferryboat highlighted an international ceremony to be held today in Dieppe Park, Windsor. This dedication, attended by Canadian and American dignitaries, will mark the return of ferryboats after a 26-year absence. The Waukegan-Detroit Ferry discontinued Detroit River service on May 15, 1942.

Peche Island will be open to the public for the first time on July 1.

Beginning Thursday at 9 a.m., Peche Island ferryboat pre-opening cruises officially open to the public. Boats will run daily from 9 a.m. to midnight from the foot of Ouellette Avenue in Windsor and the west end of Cobo Hall in Detroit. Fares for the one hour narrated cruises are \$1.95 for adults and \$1 for children between ages 5 and 12.

Powered by the most advanced turbo-charged diesel engines and built of steel, the Peche Island ferryboats surpass the strictest government safety requirements. Each boat is operated by a licensed captain and first mate.

A snack bar features sandwiches, beverages and other food items. Each boat has a sundeck which seats 60 passengers on roomy comfort seats, while the lower level accommodates 140 on comfortable vinyl bus-type seats.

Institute Buys Rare Baroque Canvas

A glowing 356-year-old Baroque painting has been formally accepted as a gift by the Detroit Institute of Arts.

Purchased for Detroit by an anonymous donor, the dramatic 17th century canvas is "Young Woman with a Violin" by Orazio Gentileschi, the Italian master (1603-1699).

The important U.S. acquisition also gives the Detroit museum a major coup in two other respects:

(1) The two-page model of 1612 is Gentileschi's soon-to-be famous daughter, Artemisia; and

(2) The Institute now is one of only three museums in the world which owns paintings by both father and daughter.

Announced by Director William F. Woods and Dr. Frederick Cummings, assistant director and head of the Institute's European department, the new Gentileschi was acquired from an English estate through Wildenstein & Co., Inc. It brings to six the number of paintings by Orazio Gentileschi in North America.

The new work will go on public display immediately in the Institute's Gallery No. 1, just south of the entrance to the Great Hall. Experts and connoisseurs will immediately compare it to Gentileschi's famed "The Lute Player" at the National Gallery in Washington.

Art Institute Offers Classes In Farmington

Instructors from the Detroit Institute of Arts will teach grade and high school classes in Farmington schools June 3 through 28.

Six once-a-week sessions will be offered at a price for enrollment and materials of \$12.50. Other classes will be offered in Ferndale and St. Clair Shores.
