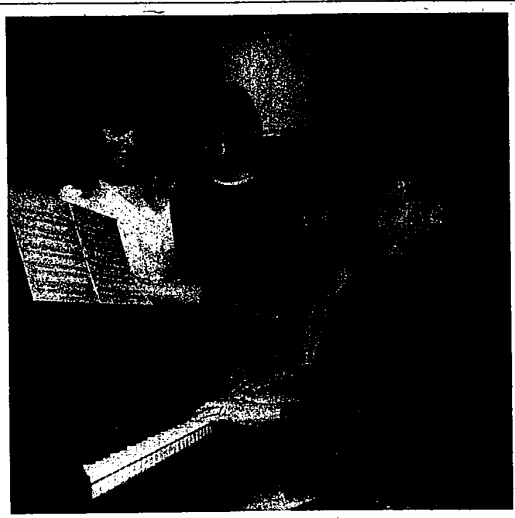

Evans In 50th Year Of Damage-Prevention

The year—1968 marks a half-century in the growth of the railroad and truck damage-prevention operation of Evans Products Company, The Plymouth, Michigan, manufacturer—producer of the well-known DF loader, DF-B bulkhead, "Air-Pak" bulkhead—introduced its first railroad device in 1918. It was a simple wooden block, grooved to fit against the wheel of an automobile to prevent shifting in transit in railroad cars.

In 1922, Evans made possible the shipment of four automobiles per freight car, instead of two, and cut damage per car from \$5.55 to 35¢. The company's early developments led to the invention of the Evans Auto-loader in 1932, which further reduced damage from 55¢ to 9¢ per car.

Twenty years ago, in 1948, Evans put into production its famous DF loader, widely used to brace a variety of general commodities in freight cars, preventing damage. More recently, in the fall of 1967, Evans announced its latest development—the "Air-Pak" bulkhead—a pneumatic device which prevents lading from shifting in any direction, laterally as well as horizontally.

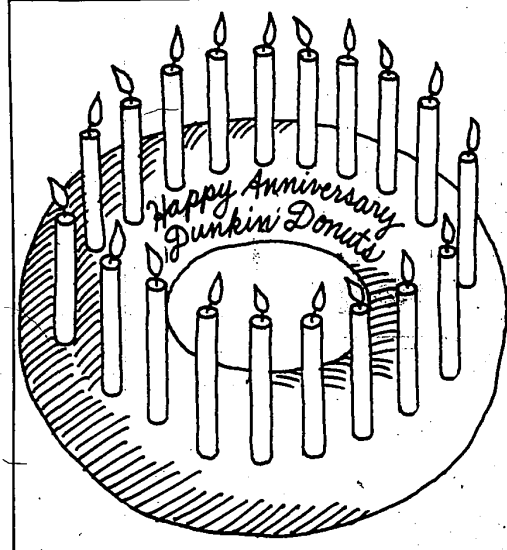
