Tigers Sign 6 Players

The Tigers have signed six free agents to play in their minor league system in 1968, it was announced by Ed Katalinas, director of player procurement.

Five of the six new farmhands performed in the junior college ranks prior to signing Tiger contracts, and two—Pitcher Ken Strickland and Outfielder George Nichols—were teammates this season at Brewton-Parker Junior College in Mt. Vernon, Ga.

Strickland and Nichols were the only new signees who were not drafted by the Tigers in the free agent draft in January, 1968. Bill Stayback, a pitcher from Glendale (Calif.) J.C. and Shortstop Rod Beckman from Muskegon Community College were Tiger selections in the regular phase of the January draft.

CHUCK SCRIVENER, a shortstop from Baltimore J.C. and infielder Tom Grayson from Guilford (N.C.) College signed with the Tigers after being chosen in the secondary phase of the draft.

All of the new Tigers will report to Lakeland, Fla. on June 11 to attend a "Second Spring Training" for two Tiger farm clubs in summer leagues. The clubs are Batavia, N.Y., in the New York-Pennsylvania League and Sarasota, Fla. in the Gulf Coast League.

Minor leaguers in college during spring training in March and new signees will participate in the 10-day training program to prepare for the summer league season. Batavia opens its season at home on June 28; Sarasota's curtain raiser will be on July 1.

The second spring training sessions will be held at Hensley Field in Lakeland under the direction of Don Lund, Tiger farm director, Ralph Snyder, his assistant, Bob Dustal, Batavia manager and Sarasota pilot Wayne Blackburn.

Fishermen are having good luck as black bass move into shallow water for spawning. Good fish were reported at Pontiac, Petoskey, Crystal, Orion and Oshtemo lakes.

EXCELLENT BLUEGILL fishing was reported at Lakeville, Wildwood, Valley, Stony Creek, Orion and Pontiac lakes. The Detroit and Huron rivers are yielding fair catches of small perch.

Teple Lake has been slow as a trout producer. The department advises early morning fishing with small worms. German brown trout are being taken from Palm Creek, and rainbows are biting in the stream just below the pond at Bald Mountain Recreation Area.

OCCASIONAL NORTHERN pike have been caught at Stony Creek and Lake Orion. Walleye fishing on Lake St. Clair has slowed down, but nice muskellunge were being taken from Anchor Bay on spoons and plugs.

Pontiac Lake has produced excellent bullheads on night-crawlers at night.

Wilson's Power Slipping

LONDON — Prime Minister Harold Wilson's hold on Britain's ruling Labor party has been threatened by an unprecedented electoral rout of his party from one end of Britain to the other. Conservatives swept Labor but of strongholds that had not known a Tory mayor in generations. In England and Wales the Laborites were left in control of only 43 town halls out of 368 and only seven were in big cities. Conservative leaders made predictable demands for Wilson to resign and call new national elections. On the basis of last Thursday's voting the Conservatives would almost certainly win.

The Detroit Olympics Friday announced the appointment of Rowe Barrett as assistant general manager of the club, succeeding Frank A. Wilbur. Wilbur resigned from the Detroit Lacrosse Club to accept the post of general manager of the Montreal Canadiens Lacrosse Club.
