City Manager John D. Dinan explains the committee had become rather inactive due to lack of enthusiasm by a portion of its membership.

## Cite Firms

Injunction suits against two Farmington corporations and an officer of both firms have been filed in the U. S. District Court in Detroit.

The actions were taken under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) by Secretary of Labor Willard Wirtz through Solicitor of Labor Charles Donahue.

The first complaint against Glad Industries, Inc., of 25455 Orchard Lake Rd., and Andrew Glad, an officer of the corporation, alleges failure to pay many employees the required time and one-half premium pay for overtime hours since November 11, 1965.

In the second complaint, against Disco Industries, Inc., at the same address, and Glad, the same allegation of failure to pay overtime pay since July 1, 1965 is made.

Judgments are being sought to enjoin and restrain the two corporations and Glad from future violations, including the restraint of withholding payment of overtime compensation found by the Court to be due employees.

## OLS To Participate In Co-op Ed Program

Our Lady of Sorrows High School will participate on a shared time basis in the Co-operative Occupational Education program of Farmington Public Schools. The announcement was made last week by

Bernard Harrington, of the Detroit Catholic Board of Education.

Sister Lauretta, Sorrows principal, met to discuss plans for the partnership with Earl Baumunk, director of vocational education, Gary Allison, trade and industrial coordinator; Robert Finzel, coordinator of retailing and office occupations; and Tom Princiensky, teacher at East Junior High School.

Topics reviewed by the group included transportation scheduling, release from classes, related instruction, application procedures, teacher evaluation, analysis of school records, and the general philosophy of co-operative education.

Princiensky who has a background as a coordinator in Moskogen, contributed information about the structure of the co-op program there.

Sister Lauretta reported that Sorrows students greeted the announcement with great enthusiasm. She remarked, "I'm very happy about this for the simple reason that it will provide greater variety to our students without taking them out of our school. I've always wanted a program whereby students, not necessarily college-oriented, could receive training on the job. It should definitely be a part of education, and I'm very pleased that it is materializing."
