

Plymouthite Shares In Golf Title

Gary Robinson, of Plymouth, and John Jakubak, of Detroit, combined for a 36-hole total of 135 to win the Salem Hills two-man bestball amateur tourney Saturday and Sunday.

Robinson, an 18-year-old senior at Plymouth High School, who also topped his school's golf team, and Jakubak, 19-year-old who just finished up playing on the University of Michigan freshman golf squad, put together par-shattering rounds of 67-68 to lead the championship flight of the 23-twoosome event.

Robinson and Jakubak captured the contest by making 11 birdies and only two bogeys over the par-72 Salem Hills layout.

Robinson canned several pressure putts for pars and birdies, and Jakubak rolled in numerous putts ranging from 15 to 35 feet for birdies.

THREE OTHER TEAMS picked up prizes in the championship flight. William Wallen, of Westland, and Julian Russell, of Detroit, posted scores of 70-68 for a 138 total. The team of Bill Anderson, and Bill Lockman, of Livonia, and the twosome of Bob Piller, of Taylor, and Tom Johnson, of Livonia, tied for fourth place with totals of 142.

Atkins Takes RU Grid Job

Redford Union High will have a new football coach next fall. Bob Atkins, who has built baseball champions for RU, has been named head man in football, replacing John Rogers, who has been promoted to assistant principal at the school.

Atkins has assisted Rogers during the latter's 10-year reign at Redford Union.

Under Rogers, RU turned out a co-Suburban League champion in 1963 and was a strong contender for loop laurels several other years.

Atkins came to RU, directly from Alma College, in addition

to football and baseball, he has worked with the school's basketball and track teams.

On the diamond, RU has won the crown in four of the last five years. The 1968 RU team won the crown outright.
