

# Sports Car Drivers Go To School

## Life Getting Brighter For Plymouth 'A' Team

Forty potential sports car racing drivers will begin a three-day course in search of their service driving licenses Friday, Saturday and Sunday (June 21, 22 and 23) at the Waterford Hills Sports Car Racing track on the grounds of the Oakland County Sportsmen's Club, located six miles north of Pontiac on Waterford Road.

The study consists of eight hours of lecture and nine hours driving instruction which involves safety and technical inspection, high speed driving indoctrination, proper braking, entrance and exit from corners, handling in traffic, emergency procedures in the cases of blow-outs, brake failure and sticking accelerators. Each candidate, upon completion of the instruction, will take a written and driving examination for his novice license.

The first class will meet at 7 p.m., Friday, June 21. Exercises on the track will be the feature of Saturday's and Sunday's activity.

Meanwhile, preparations for the Sports Car Club of America's Midwest Regional competition on June 29 and 30 are underway. Over 150 entries from Ohio, Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Pennsylvania and Michigan have been received.

June 29's racing program will consist of eight events of 10 laps (15 miles), while the cars for June 30 will feature eight races of 20 laps (30 miles) for 24 classes of sports cars.
