### EXPERTS OUTLINE PLAN FOR ESCAPE FROM HOME FIRES

Fire:  
What should you do if you awaken at night and hear that word?

Here is the advice of the National Board of Fire Underwriters:

1. Stay calm. Panic causes many deaths in fires.

2. If there's a phone in your bedroom, call the fire department immediately.

3. Test the door leading into the hall with your hand. If it feels hot — don't open it. The hallway is already filled with deadly gases. Look for another way to get out of the house — perhaps down a back stairway, over the roof, or through a window (if you sleep on the first floor).

4. If there is no other escape route, yell to arouse others, stuff cloth around the door cracks to keep gases out, open the window slightly, and wait there to await rescue.

5. If the door doesn't feel hot, hold a cloth over your nose — wet if possible — and escape through the hall, arousing others as you go.
