


Lights for poultry houses are recommended by Michigan State College poultrymen as good investments. Lights themselves do not take the place of good poultry management, they say, but good meth-



(Continued from Page Two) people of moderate circumstances, while in many cases amount to less than \$600 a year.

"The amendment doesn't hold water," hit back Dingell. "The object of this amendment is not to hurt women of small incomes, but to compel the reporting in income returns of about a billion dollars a year in dividends that escape taxation. Failure to report these dividends is a violation of the law."

Furthermore, despite what you say," working people with wages of \$150 a year sometimes are taxed. At Detroit, auto worker may work only one week in a year, but a portion of that week's wages is nonetheless withheld by the government."

GOP Rep. Dan Reed of Dunkirk, N. Y., sided with the senators, however, and the big-bracket tax-payers had a majority.

Note—Other senate tax conferees were: Byrd of Virginia, and One of the Texas, Democratic, and another of Nebraska, Republican. Of them, only Senator Connally fought for this little taxpayer.

V.F.W. COMBATS COMMUNISM

Cooperative witch-hunters who think innocent people could take a lesson from an "American way" campaign which the Veterans of Foreign Wars has launched against communism. The V. F. W. campaign stresses "community service to combat communism" on which foreign "jams" thrive—poverty, unemployment, illiteracy.

As the V.F.W.'s new commander-in-chief, Gen. of Seattle, explained to President Truman the other day: "The best way to lick communism is to get at the roots that propagate it. And those roots are chiefly poverty and ignorance. We see to it that there are no hungry children or impoverished families in this country, we don't have to worry too much about communism."

"That's the proper approach," agreed Truman. "Communism is a state of mind that is aggravated by bad economic conditions."

Garden Club Ladies Take Deer Census

Following on the heels of the 4-H club deer census, ladies of the 4-H club conservation units of the state federated Garden Clubs conducted a drive of their own which produced 63 deer in the same area.

The census was taken by garden club members while attending their 12th annual conservation conference at the conservation department's Higgins Lake training school.

The one square mile in southwestern Crawford county netted 63 deer for 4-H Club members a week before.

SAFETY CAMPAIGN TO STRESS NIGHT DRIVING HAZARDS

Night driving hazards will be the theme of the state-wide November traffic safety campaign, it was announced this week by State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard.

The campaign, one of six being undertaken this year, is sponsored by the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police and the State Safety Commission, in cooperation with the National Safety Council.

With the slogan, "Beware of the Careless Walker," special emphasis will be placed upon pedestrian safety.

Leonard pointed out that last year in Michigan alone, 7,494 pedestrians were injured and 419 killed.

"It isn't always the driver's fault," he stated. "Pedestrians take unnecessary chances and make themselves targets for injury or death, particularly at night. Nevertheless drivers should be on the watch for them, for it isn't pleasant to kill or injure a person even though you may not be at fault."

Statistics reported by 29 states show that night time driving is 33 1/2% more dangerous than driving during the day, and the night mileage death rate is three times the day death rate for cities and 2 1/2 times the day rate for rural areas.

"Police departments and safety groups throughout the state will participate in the campaign," Leonard said. "It is our hope to bring forcibly to the attention of drivers the necessity for greater vigilance when driving at night because of the extra hazards that are involved. Reduced speed, headlights and tail lights in working order and alertness will be stressed in the effort to lower the death and injury toll."




