**JUDGE SCHULTE WARNS DRIVERS NOT TO DRINK**

Judge John J. Schulte, Jr., today announced that his Court is solidly behind the December Holiday Hazard program to be conducted throughout Michigan aimed at reducing traffic accidents due to drunk driving.

As a symbol of cooperation the Judge said, "I am placing a copy of the official poster on the wall of the court room. It reads 'Drunk Drivers Lose Their Licenses' and should serve as a warning to all traffic offenders brought before this court."

He called upon all motorists to cooperate on the program. In commenting on the seriousness of drunk driving, Judge Schulte said, "I urge all patrons of bars and taverns to take note of the table cards which are to be placed on all tables and which read 'If you are driving, TAKE IT EASY.' This is sound advice and may prevent many a celebration from turning into a disaster."

The program is sponsored by the Michigan State Safety Commission, all law enforcement agencies and 69 organizations interested in safety.
