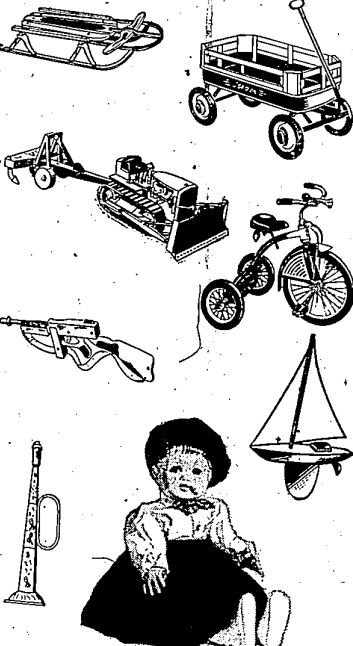

COMMISSION ASKS NEW RULES FOR 1951 FISHING

Opening southern Michigan inland lakes to angling throughout the year for taking species on which the season is closed will be recommended by the conservation commission to the 1951 legislature.

Other commission recommendations to the legislature concerning proposed changes in conservation laws would: Open season on black bass, bluegills and sunfish on the third Saturday in June rather than June 25.

Authorize cooperation director to make agreements with directors of adjoining states whereby non-resident licensees fishing in boundary waters of either state involved may fish in the same manner as resident licensees.

Allow, under permit, use of pound and trap nets with meshes less than 3/4 inches in the taking of smelt; Place state in position of accepting benefits afforded by the federal Dingell-Johnson act.

Remove five-year restriction and limit of not more than one lake or one stream per county for research purposes; Limit lake trout take from inland lakes to not more than two per day.

Eliminate regulation prohibiting trapping within 50 feet of beaver dam, permitting trapping on dam; Eliminate six-inch trap limitation.

Extend season on ruffed grouse from October 1 to November 10 in the northern lower and upper peninsulas and from October 15 to November 14 in southern lower peninsula.

Extend season on cottontails and snowshoes from October 1 to January 31 in the northern lower peninsula and from October 15 to January 1 in southern lower peninsula.

Extend raccoon season from October 1 to December 15 in the northern lower and upper peninsulas and from October 15 to December 15 in southern lower peninsula.

In the last five years 220 large coal mines - each with a daily output of 100,000 tons or more - have been opened or placed in development. These new facilities, plus other developments, have a productive capacity of 280 million tons a year.

State Park Attendance Tallied At 11,447,000

As winter activities thread into the state park scene, the conservation department announces 11,447,000 visitors and 49,500 campers tallied by the 60 park and recreation area managers. Attendance through last year at this time totaled 12,255,000 visitors and 45,000 campers, with good spring weather responsible for early crowds.

Grand Haven continues to be the most popular park with 1,235,000 visitors, followed by Dodge No. 4 with an attendance of 1,097,000 persons. Other locations attracting largest number of users include Bay City, Holland, Island Lake, Sterling, Muskegon and East Tawas.

Seven parks are closed for the season, including Aloha, Benzie, D. H. Day, Gladwin, Mears, White Cloud and Bloomer No. 1. Other locations with winter sport or deer hunting facilities will continue to be open to the public.

ANOTHER MICHIGAN HARBOR STUDY IS UNDER WAY AT U-M

Once again a model of one of Michigan's harbors is being constructed in detail inside the Lake Hydraulics Laboratory at the University of Michigan.

This time it will be a replica of the bottom of Lake Huron off Harberville. A contract for a study to determine the best location for a breakwater which will provide maximum protection for small craft.

The research is a continuation of the Michigan State Waterways Commission program being carried out by the Detroit District of the Corps of Engineers. The model studies at the University are carried on under the supervision of Dr. Ernest F. Brater, associate professor of civil engineering.

This will be the fifth study of the type to be performed at the Lake Hydraulics Lab. The others were at Port Sanilac, Port Austin, Point Lookout and Hammond Bay.

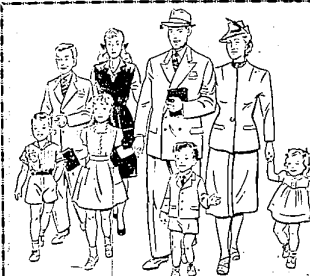

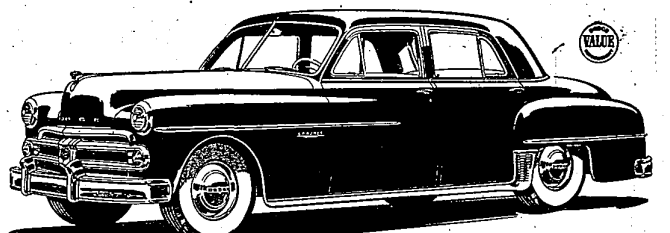
