By miscellaneous resolution Number 2415, adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Oakland County, it is resolved that in accordance with the provision of Act No. 5, Public Acts of the first special legislative seasion of 1948, the registration of voters on primary and election days is discontinued in Oakland-County, Michigan, from the effective date of said Act.
